Big Bore Range Special Meeting Results

The March 26, special meeting to discuss and vote on the big bore range improvement project was held as planned. The meeting was well attended, with 133 total members showing up to participate. A presentation on the details of the project was presented by the committee members. There was Q&A from the members, a break for lunch, and ultimately a vote. When all the votes were counted, the final tally was 122 votes in favor of proceeding with the project and 11 opposed. This vote gave the go-ahead to move ahead, finalize the details for the project, begin fundraising in earnest, seek financing for the project if that is necessary, and line up a contractor. The committee has met several times since and has formed several subcommittees to address various aspects of the project as there is a great deal of work yet to be done.



On behalf of the committee members who have invested years of volunteer effort getting to this point, I would like thank all of the members who took the time to attend this meeting, listen, share their opinions, and make their voices heard. It is the interest and support of the membership that will make this project a success.

As has been mentioned, this will be a large, complex and expensive project. In spite of the cost, this will yield an enduring result that will not only provide us all a greatly improved facility, but will provide ongoing dividends to our club and is a legacy that we can all leave to our next generations. The total budget voted for this project is \$250,000. Of this, \$40,000 will be paid from the general club treasury, and the remaining amount will need to be raised. This money will come from a combination of member donations, fundraisers such as raffles or auctions, bank (or other) financing, and grants or sponsorships that can be secured.

All members should by now have received a pledge letter outlining the our initial donation recognition structure. We hope that all members will make some donation in whatever amount they are able.

The more we are able to raise in this manner, the less we will need to seek financing for. We have already received \$13,138 in donations from a handful of members as well as an M1 Garand rifle and other very nice items that will be used for auction or raffles. Please consider supporting this very ambitious and worthwhile project, it is an investment in our future.


Lowell AVCO Pistol team Wins First Place in the MVPL C Division

NRA RANGE SAFETY OFFICER COURSE Next course is July 23, 2016



Steel Target .22 Rimfire Shoot

The number of participants at the March 19, Steel Target Rimfire Shoot was larger than we had anticipated; twenty-five shooters, both members and nonmembers showed up, one or two of which drove to the club from as far away as Connecticut. All the work put into running and organizing the event was much appreciated by everyone present. It was a good crowd, there were some shooters from each skill bracket- from newer shooters to those who had their technique down to muscle memory.



The setup on the .22 range allowed us to keep a steady rotation of shooters on the five-yard firing line, and the fifteen-yard line was just as efficient at keeping people shooting when we'd gotten around to the riflery portion of the event. The whole event's continuity greatly benefitted from Rick Plzak and Charlie O'Donnell, the members who organized and were running the shoot. They saw to it that there was very little down time between each group of shooters and that everyone's scores were recorded.

Everything about the event was just as we had hoped it would be; people were shooting just to



enjoy it, and the variety of firearms that made appearances was equally fun to see. From standard target pistols to converted 1911s and even a few revolvers, everyone had something that made their shooting all the more interesting to watch for those who were awaiting their turn on the line.

For a March day it was a bit cool out in the earlier hours of the event; but there was hardly a cloud in the sky, and we had plenty of coffee and donuts to go around. All in all, the event was a success in every regard. The next scheduled steel target shoots are on Saturdays, June 4th, and August 6, which I hope will be just as much of a success as this past one was, especially with the weather getting warmer as summer draws closer.
